

## New Ignition Interlock Device (IID) Restriction

### New Information

Effective July 1, 2009, legislation requires the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to immediately impose an Ignition Interlock Device (IID) restriction to the driving privilege of a person convicted of driving while suspended or revoked for Driving under the Influence (DUI), *California Vehicle Code* (CVC) §§14601.2, 14601.4, or 14601.5. Imposition of the IID restriction **does not** allow a person to drive without a valid driver license.

The restriction will be imposed for the following term which begins on the date of conviction for driving with a suspended license:

- 12-month restriction with one prior conviction of CVC §§23152, 23153, or 23103.5 within ten years of the violation.
- 24-month restriction with two prior convictions of CVC §§23152, 23153, or 23103.5, or one prior conviction of CVC §§14601.2, 14601.4, or 14601.5 within ten years of the violation.
- 36-month restriction with three or more prior convictions of CVC §§23152, 23153, or 23103.5, or two or more prior convictions of CVC §§14601.2, 14601.4, or 14601.5 within ten years of the violation.
