PROJECT OBJECTIVE:

(1) To demonstrate the utility of, and need for, an integrated management information system, (2) to implement a rudimentary system as a demonstration of the feasibility of developing a full-fledged management information system, and (3) to chart a course for the future development of a management information system.

SUMMARY:

This report was developed in three parts to fulfill the three project objectives. In March 1986, Part I, a paper entitled "Analysis of Field Office Productivity and Efficiency," reported on extensive analyses conducted to predict staffing and resource allocation based on FO 56 Volume/Time Report workload indicators and Phase II Production Statistics. Part 2, a paper presented on March 10, 1986, provided an extensive discussion on the need for an integrated management information system (MIS), and proposed a design which integrated database functioning, analytical capabilities, and graphic presentation into a single system. Part 3, dated July 25, 1986, further developed specifications of a rudimentary MIS with capabilities for statistical analysis and graphical presentation.

IMPLEMENTATION STATUS OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

None. The proposed model was not implemented.
