## .0100 Year of Manufacture (YOM) License Plate Program

Stipulations from the *California Code of Regulations*, Title 13, Article 3.3  
§§201.00–205.14

YOM License Plates were originally issued by the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). YOM License Plates will be authenticated by DMV personnel and:

- Must be supplied by the vehicle owner.
- May be restored/painted but **cannot** deviate from the original colors or configurations.
- Year stickers **must** be attached to the license plate prior to registration.
- 1963 and newer configurations **must** be assigned to the specific vehicle for which it was intended (**FOR EXAMPLE**, auto to auto, commercial to commercial, trailer to trailer, motorcycle to motorcycle).
- 1963–1969 year model auto vehicles **must** have a black license plate with yellow characters within the alpha-numeric series of AAA000–YYY999.
- 1963–1969 year model commercial vehicles or pickups **must** have a black license plate with yellow characters within the alpha-numeric series of A00000–Z99999.
- 1970–1972 commercial vehicles or pickups **must** have a blue license plate with yellow characters within the alpha-numeric series of 00000A–99999Z.

Other information for the YOM program:

- License plate colors may vary slightly due to age and exposure.
- License plates issued may vary in length and width by up to a 1/8 of an inch (when license plate sizes were standardized) prior to 1956.
- Environmental License Plates (ELP) (personalized license plates) are not valid for YOM registration because they were not issued until 1973.

**NOTE:** The information contained in the following chart pages was gathered from various resources and may be incomplete. Each YOM License Plate application is reviewed for authenticity and determined acceptable or not, on a case-by-case basis.

## .0110 Commercial License Plates

For commercial license plates, use the automobile license plate chart and the information below to verify license plates issued during the 1930s, 1940s, and 1970s.

The YOM program extends through 1972 for commercial vehicles only because the black commercial license plates supply was not exhausted by the end of 1969. Black and blue license plates were issued to commercial vehicles from 1970-1973. Therefore, blue license plates are included in the YOM program for commercial vehicles from 1970-1972.
